Bar-B-Que Brisket

- 1, 7-8 pound brisket
- 4 onions, coarsely chopped
- 2 cups boiling water
- 2 cups ketchup
- 4 Tbs. vinegar
- 4 Tbs. Worcestershire sauce
- 4 Tbs. brown sugar
- 2 Tbs. chili powder
- Dash paprika

Mix onions, boiling water, ketchup, vinegar, Worcestershire sauce, brown sugar, chili powder, and paprika together. Put half the sauce in bottom of 15"x10"x3" roasting pan. Lay brisket on top of sauce and cover with remaining sauce. Cover and seal with heavy-duty foil. Bake in 350 oven for 4 hours. About halfway through baking time, baste with sauce.
